Glamping at Camp Cecil on Isla Espiritu Santo

Espiritu Santo National Park in the Sea of Cortez is part of a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and is one of the best marine life viewing destinations in the world. We have a base camp on one of the island's most beautiful beaches that features beautifully decorated walk-in safari-style tents with real beds, lovely linens, bedside tables, lanterns, beach towels, rugs, chairs, and more. Espiritu Xantus Café is where our onsite chef makes wonderful meals for you every day – and daily happy hour of course - and there are two sun showers and two compost toilet cabañas. This trip includes many adventures such as:

- Swimming with whale sharks / swimming with sea lions
- Kayaking / Stand Up Paddle Boarding / Snorkeling
- Bird Watching / Star Gazing / Hiking / Reading / Chillin'

December 2:

- Arrive at the La Paz airport and transfer to Costa Baja Resort
- 7:00 PM: Welcome dinner and trip briefing at Costa Baja

December 3:

- 8:00 AM: Breakfast
- 9:00 AM: Meet in Costa Baja lobby for transfer to courtesy dock
 - 9:30 AM: Swimming with Whale Sharks! We'll start off our great adventure by swimming with the largest fish in the world – the whale shark. These gentle giants look fierce, but they eat only plankton so all human flesh is safe!
 11:30 AM: Transfer to Isla Espiritu Santo for Glamping!
 - After a lovely lunch prepared by our camp chef, we can decide how to spend the balance of the day depending on weather and interests. Activities can include swimming with sea lions, kayaking, SUP, bird watching, hiking – or doing nothing at all! 5:00 PM: Happy Hour, followed by dinner and star-gazing





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December 4:

• All Day:

Nothing but food, fun and the fabulous Espiritu Santo in the Sea of Cortez!

Breakfast, lunch, dinner all prepared fresh on the spot by our camp chef – and happy hour too! Our bilingual, naturalist guides – who are all certified Wilderness First Responders – can help you plan the perfect day: Kayak, SUP and/or snorkel out in the water to see if you can find the whales, dolphins, sea turtles, manta rays and huge number of tropical fish who call the surrounding area home. Add to your lifetime birding list by visiting a Blue-footed Booby or Magnificent Frigatebird rookery, check out the Reddish Egrets and Yellow-footed Gulls, maybe see an American Oystercatcher or a White Ibis on the hunt. Or take a hike in the hills to see if you can find some of the species endemic to the island like the babisuri - a ring-tailed cat, or the black rabbit. Or just sit on the beach, soak it all in and enjoy being so thoroughly spoiled in such thoroughly unspoiled nature.


December 5:

Morning:	One last island adventure! Perhaps swim with the sea lions puppies, maybe do a kayak journey to another bay, maybe climb to the highest point to get your panoramic shots of the area- just enjoy the final hours of such pristine beauty.
1:00 PM	Lunch
2:00 PM:	Return to the CostaBaja courtesy dock, landing around 3:00 PM. Afternoon free to relax and explore.
7:00 PM:	Farewell dinner at CostaBaja

December 6:

Morning:

Breakfast at CostaBaja then transfer to airport. Say adios, but not good-bye!





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Number of Participants:

• Maximum of 10. Tents can have one king or two single beds so participants should specify their preferences.

- Drinks at happy hour and first two drinks at dinner on island
- All adventures and related equipment as indicated in itinerary
- National park permit for Espiritu Santo

- International airfare

• \$550 + airfare


Cancellation Policies:

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GLAMPING PACKING LIST

Days generally will be warm and sunny with lots of sun exposure. Nights generally will be very cool on the island.

Highly Recommended:

- Swim suit
- Wide-brimmed hat
- Comfortable walking shoes
- Beach shoes
- Light-weight walking pants and/or shorts
- Tee-shirts or similar
- Polar fleece (cold at night)
 Prescription medications
- Pajamas
- Windbreaker
- Sun shirts
- Socks and underwear
- Water bottle (need 1 liter)
- Small day pack
- Sunglasses
- Small flashlight/headlamp with extra batteries

Highly Recommended:

- Sunblock for skin and lips
- Camera and extra batteries
- Travel alarm clock
- Insect repellent
- Toiletries such as shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, etc.

Optional:

- Field guides
- Notebook and pen
- Anti-itch cream for bites
- Anti-diarrhea medication
